

The Camino de Santiago by Jim and Lorraine Ruder

We hiked over 450 miles of The Camino de Santiago, across Northern Spain this spring, tracing the path established St. James the Apostle as he spread the good news of Christianity into a region of what is now Spain. We walked about 12-14 miles each of the 35 hiking days, and built in 5 rest/exploration days. It was an amazing experience with so many opportunities to reflect on our faith, nurture our appreciation for the diversity of fellow Pilgrims (hikers) from around the world, grow in awe of the simple beauties in nature, and to humble ourselves. The belief of how each Pilgrim who embarks on the journey will inevitably discover their own personal Camino soon resonated with us. We met people, ages 8-85 on the trail, some traveling with friends or family, and some were on



their own. We benefited from the goodwill shared among Pilgrims and the gracious hosts who live in Northern Spain. Despite establishing a rather doable pace and routine, we were surprised to learn that it never became automatic to hike the distance to our next destination like a commute via car can become. We endured blisters, muscle aches, and shin splints. We gained a new appreciation for distance and time. The overriding faith message for us was love- love of ourselves, all other people, our planet Earth, and above all, our God. We, Lorraine and Jim, would be glad to meet with you for a Morning Conversation following the 9:00 Service on Sunday, July 2 in order to share more pictures or answer questions you might have. As much as we enjoy traveling it has always been a joy to return to Wisconsin, and specifically our home in Verona and the St. James Church Community. A Pilgrim's Prayer, which we came upon in the middle of the hike at a tiny little Catholic Church, which was once the church of the individual Priest, who took it upon himself in the late 1960s to paint yellow arrows to provide necessary guidance through cities, woods, farms, and vast open fields is attached. Over 250,000 people are expected to hike at least a portion of the trail this year.

Pilgrims' Prayer

Although I may have traveled all the roads, crossed mountains and valleys from East to West, if I have not discovered the freedom to be myself, I have arrived nowhere. Although I may have shared all of my possessions with people of other languages and cultures; made friends with Pilgrims of a thousand paths, or shared albergues with saints and princes, if I am not capable of forgiving my neighbor tomorrow, I have arrived nowhere. Although I may have carried my pack from beginning to end and waited for every Pilgrim in need of encouragement, or given my bed to one who arrived later than I, given my bottle of water in exchange for nothing; if upon returning




to my home and work, I am not able to create brotherhood or make happiness, peace and unity, I have arrived nowhere. Although I may have had food and water each day, and enjoyed a roof and shower every night; or may have had my injuries well attended, If I have not discovered in all that the love of God, I have arrived nowhere. Although I may have seen all the monuments and contemplated the best sunsets; although I may have learned a greeting in every language or tried the clean water from every fountain; if I have not discovered who is the author of so much free beauty and so much peace, I have arrived nowhere. If from today I do not continue walking on my path, searching far and living according to what I have learned; if from today I do not see in every person, friend or foe a companion on the Camino; if from today I cannot recognize God, the God of Jesus of Nazareth as the one God of my life, I have arrived nowhere. Lori Rudy Retirement




