From the Pastor

For thus said the Lord God, the Holy One of Israel: In returning and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and in trust shall be your strength. — Isaiah 30.15

As we enter the fall season we tend to talk about the slower days of summer are soon past us, and the busyness of life is soon returning. Parents I talk to are almost resigned to being exhausted once again. Many of us feel like we can keep up, or catch up. There's not only so much to do, there's so much to improve.

The rich tradition of Christian spirituality invites us to another place — to move away from seeing our lives as a constant a striving ("I can do better, be better!"). This also means moving away from the notion that being a disciple is basically an ongoing self-improvement project ("I can do better, be better!"). And here's the trap: because there's always more to improve upon, we're never done, and if we're never done, we never rest.

The spiritual masters remind us that life isn't about speed, or activity, or even accomplishment. Your life isn't even about you — it's about who you are in God, God who is with us in the midst of our busy, often messy, lives. This is where true rest is found — not in being away from life's demands, but being in the presence of God.

The seventeenth century monk, Brother Lawrence, in his famous book "Practicing the Presence of God," writes:

I have abandoned all particular forms of devotion, all prayer techniques. My only prayer practice is attention. I carry on a habitual, silent, and secret conversation with God that fills me with overwhelming joy.

The most holy and important practice in the spiritual life is the presence of God-that is, every moment to take great pleasure that God is with you.

In Thornton Wilder's play, *Our Town*, Emily Webb dies as a young adult. In the final act, she returns to view one day: her twelfth birthday, this time as an outsider. As she watches herself, she realizes how much we miss. Emily asks the Stage Manager, "Do any human beings ever realize life while they live it?—every, every minute?" "No. (*Pause*) The saints and poets, maybe – they do some," he says. In other words, it's rare that someone truly notices their life while they're in it — how precious and beautiful the moments and people in it. And yet, the opportunity to notice is also with us.

Imagine a poet, or a painter, or a composer, rushing through their work. I doubt we'd want to see, or read, or hear their work. You and I are called to be artists in our own lives. But if we rush through them, what do we fail to see, and who do we neglect to be? And so the Apostles' Creed begins — I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth — a confession that life is a gift, a gift to be treasured.

Classes Offered

8:30 Pray & Play

Ages 3-Kindergarten

Children begin in worship with their parents and stay for the children's message. They are then led downstairs for Bible stories, activities and play inspired by the Spark Lectionary curriculum. Pray and play ends with Music Time from 9:30-9:45.

9:30 Spark Sunday School PreK-4th Grade

Students meet in the Youth Lounge at 9:30am, participate in Bible songs, stories, crafts and games stations inspired by the Spark Lectionary curriculum. Parents may pick up their PreK-2nd graders from the Youth Lounge at 10:30am.

3rd-4th graders will NOT require a parent to pick them up.

9:30 Club Connect

5th Grade - 6th Grade

Students meet in their classroom where they'll enjoy time to hang out, chat and play games. They'll also begin to prepare for Confirmation with age-appropriate lessons inspired by the Connect curriculum. They'll dig deeper into Bible stories, relating them to current life experiences and will also have opportunities to serve as helpers and peer leaders for the younger students. 5th & 6th graders will be dismissed at 10:30am.

This year, we welcome Laura Smith as our Director of Confirmation. Laura has been a member at St. James since 2004 and has been teaching Confirmation for the past several years. She and her husband, Mark, are parents to four daughers: Annelisa, Alaina, Elizabeth, and Sophia. Welcome!

Our Program

Confirmation is a 2-year program, designed for students seeking to affirm their baptismal promise. This typically happens during 7th and 8th grade, however, we welcome older students as well. We will take an in-depth look at the Bible, Lutheran history and catechism and Lutheran living. We will explore what it means to be disciples of Jesus, strengthen our sense of community as members of St. James and solidify our mission to **receive, grow and give**. Our goal is not only to provide instruction and teach content, but to work together with families, holistically nurturing the seeds of faith. This year we will be focusing on the Bible - both the Old and New Testaments.

Receiving, Growing, Giving:

Successful completion of the St. James Confirmation program is reliant on student participation in the following areas each year.

Worship Attendance - Attend/view at least 20 worship services per year.

Worship Participation - Participate in worship or devotionals 2 times per year.
