#### From the Pastor



Advent is coming, literally. *Adventus* is a Latin word meaning coming, or arrival. We are waiting for Advent — for Advent, the season of waiting. "What are you waiting for?" is a question Advent asks you and me. And so we wait. We might wait in hope, or in fear, or in expectation, or even in boredom. But Advent calls us to wait in faith, and to get ready, to prepare, and make use of the time.

Consider this parable, as told by Rabbi Jonathan Sacks:

A young man, having troubled over the question, asks his father: "Why does the Messiah not come? Maybe in former times the Jews were not ready, but now, having endured the Holocaust and returned to Israel, surely they are ready."

"I will tell you, my son," said the Rebbe. "How could the Messiah come? Consider: if he were a *hassid* of one sect, the *hassidim* of the other sects would not recognize him. If he were a hassid of any kind, the *mitnagdim*, their opponents,

would not recognize him. If he were Orthodox, the Reform Jews would not recognize him. If he were religious, the secular Jews would not recognize him. How then can he come?

"And now," continued the Rebbe, "I will tell you a great secret." The Rebbe dropped his voice to a whisper. "It is not we who are waiting for the Messiah. It is the Messiah who is waiting for us. He has been here all the time. It is we who are not yet ready for him."

What would it take to be ready for the Messiah? It might mean doing things differently. It might mean foregoing the rush-rush of the holiday season: doing less, purchasing less, and in its place finding time and space for reflection, for quiet, for preparing our lives for the arrival of Christ's coming — not at some far, distance point in time, but now.

We value "filling the calendar" rather than "creating empty time." What about Advent waiting as being a time for prayer, for reading, writing, reflection? These contemplative practices are suited for Advent waiting, Advent hope, and Advent expectation.

While Advent calls us to wait and prepare for the coming of Christ, Advent is not about preparing our homes as much as it is preparing our hearts: "Am I ready to meet Christ who comes to me in the form of my *neighbor*?" That is, in the form of the one who needs my help, my support, my presence.

Your *neighbor*, in Christian terms, is the one through whom God calls you, speaks to you, makes demands on you. That is the great seriousness and great blessedness of the Advent: Christ is standing at the door, Christ who lives in the form of a human being among us. Will you close the door or open it?

I close with a portion of a letter written to his fiancée by the Lutheran pastor and martyr Dietrich Bonhoeffer, executed by the Nazis in April of 1945. It was sent to from Tegel prison:

I think we're going to have an exceptionally good Christmas. The very fact that every outward circumstance precludes our making provision for it will show whether we can be content with what is truly essential. I used to be very fond of thinking up and buying presents, but now that we have nothing to give, the gift God gave us in the birth of Christ will seem all the more glorious; the emptier our hands, the better we understand what Luther meant by his dying words: "We're beggars; it's true." The poorer our quarters, the more clearly we perceive that our hearts should be Christ's home on earth.

Dear Jesus, may your light shine in the darkness. Amen.

## Council Update

Hello St James Family,

I would like to give a quick update on the process as we begin on calling our next Pastor to St James. We are in the preparation phase of this process and we have two major pieces to complete during this phase. The first piece decided by the council was to have the Synod appoint a full-time interim pastor. However, due to staffing shortages across southern Wisconsin we may be appointed only a part-time pastor. The good news is that after speaking with the Synod, they do have an interim they would like the Council to meet within the next few weeks.



The second piece is to form a transition team which will work side by side with the interim pastor to prepare the congregation for our next pastor and identify the type of leader who needs to be called to our church. Members of this team should represent a wide cross section of the church including people of different ages and various lengths of time at the church. Council will appoint members to this team at their November 28 meeting.

This transition phase is a time for prayer and discernment, not only about our next pastor, but also about our congregation's mission and future. A pastoral call is not a simple hire, but the beginning of a long spiritual relationship with a pastor and congregation. The process could take 2-3 months or 4-8 months or even longer. The timing is unknown at this point but know we are making a very important decision in our church lives and good things come to those who wait!

If you have more concerns or wish to share your thoughts or worries, anyone from council, including myself, is available to talk or listen.

In the weeks and months to come, please remember this transition and call process in your prayers.

#### **Current State**

The financials show that we are on track from a budget perspective to date in being behind budget overall by just \$2,500 on a net basis thru October. This also shows that our giving is running behind budget by 5% thru October but that lower than budgeted expenses have helped to offset most of the giving shortfall.

In comparing to the prior year, we can see that our giving is on pace with the prior year but that even with controlled spending, expenses are running 2% higher than last year. Thank you to all for your generous giving support of the mission of St. James so far this year.

#### **Future State**

The church year giving history trends for higher giving levels in November and December to close out the year. This occurs as we enter the holiday season, for year-end tax deductions, and other personal reasons. November and December are very important giving months in the St. James church year and this year is no different as your generous contributions will fulfill a balanced budget to support the mission and vision here at St. James for 2023. Thank you very much for your support and if possible, please consider increasing your church giving by 5%-10% or more to end the year strong. To illustrate, the following are the budgeted offering contributions for remainder of 2023:

As you can see, for November and December combined, the budgeted offerings are \$40,000 higher than the September and October total. This matches the historical giving pattern for our congregation as last year the November and December combined offerings totaled \$129,000 which was \$55,000 higher giving than September and October last year. Increased giving in November and December is important to live out our strong mission. Together we can do this again and your prayerful and thoughtful generous giving is greatly appreciated! As Pastor Peter has creatively introduced the 2024 Stewardship theme, it also holds true in 2023....

"Consider the Lilies. That is, consider the gift that is your life – your life created by God, redeemed by Jesus, and sustained by the Holy Spirit. All gifts...now, and forever."


### Thanksgiving Outreach



## From the Parish Nurse...

It's hard to believe the year is almost over, but December is a very busy time for most of us. We have the most important time, that of Jesus' Birthday and most of us are more than busy getting ready for Christmas celebrations at church and in our homes with families. Some of us are planning on traveling near and far to be with loved ones. Remember to pace yourselves. Get plenty of sleep, eat food that's good for you, exercise, and limit your alcohol. Don't be afraid to say "No", so that you don't overextend your generosity.

Be aware how you are feeling physically, emotionally, and mentally. For many people, the darker days of fall and winter trigger what is called SAD, or Seasonal Affective Disorder. As Christians, honoring our mission of, **Receive**, **Grow**, **Give**, we have an opportunity to reach out to those who are more isolated and alone this Holiday Season and beyond. It not only helps others, but ourselves as well.


Some symptoms of SAD may be: Feeling sad or having a depressed mood; Loss of interest of pleasure in activities once enjoyed; Changes in appetite; Change in sleep; Loss of energy or increased fatigue despite sleeping more hours. Consider contacting your care provider if symptoms begin to escalate. It is a positive move to treat your symptoms if warranted.

Beside the things mentioned above, prioritize social activities. There is a causal relationship between social isolation and depression. Try to reach out to another person and in that way, it helps them by helping yourself. Zoom calls with another, phone call and meet for cocoa or coffee, meet at church for service and coffee hour. Be sure you are getting enough Vitamin D. Sunlight, Supplements, and what is called "Bright Light Therapy". Typically, 20 to 30 minutes sitting in front of the box each day will possibly alter a change in your brain that boosts your mood and elevates symptoms of SAD. Always check with your health care provider before beginning supplements and whether a light therapy box is right for you. Keep a strict schedule involving when to go to bed and when to get up and when and what to eat. Lastly, let the light in!!! I'm not only implying open your curtains and let as much early light in each day, but Pray on a regular basis. Remember," Our Lord is the Light of the World and through Him, all things are possible."
